Fall Reunion

The Fall Reunion is coming soon. It will take place in the China Masonic Temple in Taipei from Friday September 22nd and Saturday September 23rd.

A welcome party will be organized on the Thursday 21st evening, from 18:00 h at the China Masonic Temple. The closing banquet will be on the evening of Saturday 22nd, from 18:30 h, at the Sunworld Dynasty Hotel.

This Program is almost a replica of the 2016 edition with the performance in long form of the 4th, 14th, 18th, 26th, 30th and 32nd. The 26th degree will replace the 27th at the initiative of our Indian brethren.

It will start on the 22nd at 8:00 h by the ceremonies of investiture and coronation of the new promotion of KCCH and IGH.

The Registration fees of last year are maintained: 2,000 NTD (70 USD), including refreshments and banquet. Additional guest for banquet will be charged 1,500 NTD (50 USD). Guided tours to the House of the Temple are available throughout the session days. Designed by the famous architect John

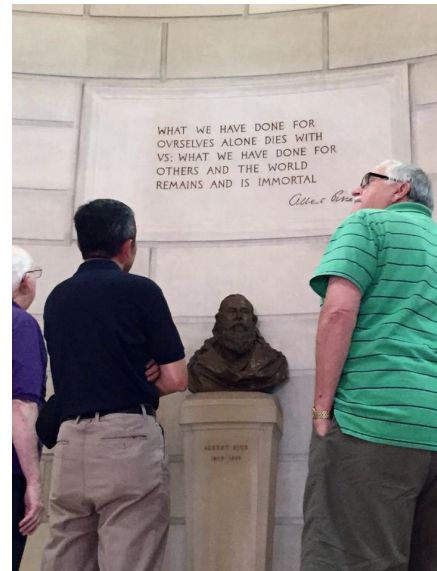

What we have done for others and the world remains and is immortal." The exhibits in the Albert Pike room tell more about this great Masonic leader. On Sunday, August 20, the welcome reception at 1pm offered all delegates an opportunity to know each other. At 3:30 everyone was guided to the nearby St. John's Episcopal Church (which the President of the US attends) for Vesper Service. Grand Chaplain III. Ken Lyons delivered an insightful sermon "Little Things Mean a Lot" which left everyone something to ponder. In the evening, all grand masters and their ladies were invited to attend the Sovereign Grand Commander's Dinner. I presented a Liu-Li glass artwork to the Commander as the greeting and appreciation from Grand lodge of China.

On Monday, August 21, the opening and business session was attended by over 1000 members and guests. After the impressive opening ritual, each grand master was announced name and greeted by the Sovereign Grand Commander one by one. The Commander gave his welcome remarks, various officers then made reports on their respective duties. It is comforting to know that the Supreme Council is doing quite well. A partial sun eclipse occurred during the day, and all participants were provided special glasses to observe the eclipse. This is probably the best entertainment one can get when attending a conference. After lunch, a "Freemasonry Q & A session with Arturo de Hoyos" was scheduled at 3-4:30pm for those who sought further light in Masonry. Main queries of the session were on different rituals of various Masonic rites. It is good to know what we didn't know... and still don't know. At 8pm, "The Bright Lights of the Scottish Rite Variety Show" performed by talented brethren opened to entertain the guests. We've got talents in our brotherhood!

On Tuesday, August 22, at 10am, a proficient ritual team delivered a flawless ceremony to confer white caps to some 100 33°Elects. Hermes Trismegiste

At the beginning of Christian era, Hermes Trismegiste has been considered as prominent philosopher whose writings were supposed to date from remote Egyptian antiquity, supposedly before Moses times.



His main writings consist in a *Corpus Hermeticum*, and *Tabula Smaragdina* (Table of Emerald). They contain a mixture of mysticism and of Egyptian occult magic . They were however endorsed at least in part by prominent "Fathers of the Catholic church", such as Augustin and Lactance (4th century). Although these scholars might have been embarrassed by some magic aspects, the writings of Hermes were considered as precursor of Platonism and of the Christianity. They are not far from gnostic philosophy.

Lactance wrote in his Institutes that Hermes "affirms the majesty of unique and supreme god, whom he designates by the same names as we do: God and Father". He also quoted Hermes as saying; " the Lord and Creator of everything we justly call God as he created a second God visible and sensible ", announcing the coming of the Christ.

A comprehensive translation in latin of part of the *Corpus Hermeticum* was done in 1490 by Marsilio Ficino, an Italian scholar and catholic priest. Ficino was one of the most influential humanist philosophers of the early Italian Renaissance. He entertained the legend of Egyptian Antiquity of Hermes Trismegiste for all the 15th century. His translation was named *Poimandres*, by the name of first chapter.

An Italian Scholar Giordano Bruno was very instrumental in the propagation of the Hermes philosophy. He also published several writings about the art of memory based upon Egyptian occultism.

During 15th and 16th centuries, the writings of Hermes inspired philosophers and also alchemists with the magic aspects of the works. From his name come the word Hermeticism which defines the philosophical and esoteric tradition which developed strongly from that period. Isaac Newton was well known for his interest in hermetic science of the *Corpus Hermeticum*. His translation of the *Tabula Smaragdina* is appended to this text.

The influence of hermeticism is also important in the works of Robert Fludd, (1574-1637) British astrologer and alchemist, and may also be found in the Rose Croix philosophy of which Fludd was an adept.

It has to be noted that this period saw also the birth of the "Old Charges" of the Freemasonry. Cooke manuscript is dated 1490 (first appearance of Hermes in Masonic documents), the Second Statutes Shaw are dated 1599.... It also see the development of speculative Freemasonry and the first speculative Masons are also known for their acquaintance with hermeticism (Elia Ashmole, 1617-1692) and it is very thinkable that hermetic writings inspired the symbolism of Freemasonry.

Although it was demonstrated that Hermes Trismegiste writings were to be dated from the beginning of Common Era (Isaac Casaubon in 1614), the Egyptian Hermeticism remains strongly influential, and was one source of inspiration of Albert Pike (*Morals and Dogma*).

This period also see a revival of the art of memory, developed earlier by Greek and Romans. Memorization was based upon the association of a speech with the visit of a building, linking the various part of the speech to specific apartment. From these circumstances, we could understand the relation of our rituals with the Temple of Solomon and the construction.

*Tis true without error, certain & most true.
That which is below is like that which is above & that which is above is
like that which is below to do the miracles of one only thing
And as all things have been & arose from one by the [meditation] of one:
so all things have their birth from this one thing by adaptation.
The Sun is its father, the moon its mother, the wind hath carried it in its
belly, the earth is its nurse.*

*The father of all perfection in the whole world is here.
Its force or power is entire if it be converted into earth.
Separate thou the earth from the fire, the subtle from the gross sweetly
with great industry.
It ascends from the earth to the heaven & again it descends to the earth
& receives the force of things superior & inferior.
By this means you shall have the glory of the whole world
& thereby all obscurity shall fly from you.
Its force is above all force. For it vanquishes every subtle thing &
penetrates every solid thing.
So was the world created.
From this are & do come admirable adaptations whereof the means (or
process) is here in this. Hence I am called Hermes Trismegist, having the
three parts of the philosophy of the whole world
That which I have said of the operation of the Sun is accomplished &
ended*
